



Supporting The Church The Easy Way—New Year

Did you know that our church is involved in a lot of ministries that need your help but do NOT involve any money? One of those is the KROGER Card. Why not buy your everyday groceries, birthday par-

ty fixings at Kroger and help the church at the same time? To participate in the Kroger card ministry you start by buying a card from Laura in the office for \$5.00 (it is loaded already with \$5.00, so it cost you nothing). Then you take it to Kroger and buy you groceries like usual. When you get ready to check out, before you get ready to go through the checkout with your groceries or pharmacy or gas pump tell the check out person you want to LOAD your card. Put the amount you think you want to spend or your allotted amount for the month. You still get your gas points, you still get your senior discount and the church gets a 4% pay off at the end of the month. The Wesley group will then take this money and use it to help buy food for food baskets at Christmas for the hungry.

Missionary News—

One of the young believers, as often happens in missions, the actual seminar turned out to be quite different than we anticipated. We expected 7 young women from the shelter and instead, only 3 attended. But the rest of the class of 8 included the social worker from the shelter, 2 older women from a Roman Catholic church in Chimbote who have organized a shelter in their city and wanted to learn from the Lima experience, plus 2 other older women from the Villa Maria Methodist Church in New Chimbote. Most of the young women in the shelter attend a nearby Assembly of God church and the ones who participated in our class were fairly new believers who are still trying to reconcile their trust in God with their traumatic past experiences.

A good moment in the discussions Catholic Church is a public defender working with women and children. She and her friend were somewhat surprised by the theme of the course: they thought they were coming to a seminar on working with battered women. As the class went on, they became more and more engaged in the discussions.

During lunch on Saturday, she said, "This is the missing piece! We are providing counseling and legal aid to the women in our shelter, but what they really need is this kind of connection with God."

Her friend was equally excited. "I didn't know I was going to have a weekend of spiritual renewal! I feel so much more strengthened in my faith through this seminar."

Our faith was also strengthened: the presence of the Roman Catholic women was a testimony to the power of the Lord and His love, given the animosity that has historically separated Catholics and Protestants in Peru. Our courses are focused on practical Christian living based on what God has told us in His Word, and, once again, we saw the power of God's love to overcome divisions.

A Hungarian friend and I got to help with a Christmas pro-gram at a girls' detention facility; making ginger-bread, doing crafts, and hearing their life stories. It's incredible what these girls have been through! Abandoned as babies, raped by their fathers, and unloved by their families. Prugs, alcohol, fights...what reason (in their minds) do they have to live a selfless, kind, pure life?

Last Saturday we went to a disabled home to sing earols and do Christmas erafts with them. It was so fun but it does stretch your comfort zone working with people who have no social or physical boundaries. They loved coming up to us and rubbing their heads against us or grabbing our hands and talking to us They just need the gift of touch and love this Christmas! Sometimes I forget what it's like to not really be able to communicate with people other than to use the language of love.

We also collected shoebox gifts for about 50 children at a homeless centre. Pray for these children to receive the gift of Jesus as they accept their shoeboxes!
