



Dear Friends of Jesus Christ,

We are asking for your prayers again, this time for a trip to India. On Wednesday, Barbara and I are off to Bangalore for two weeks of training with women from 2 states: Karnataka and Maharashtra.

Rhoda and Jessie have been busy over the last year leading groups of *Becoming a Woman of God* in a number of sites. There has been a very good response to their ministry and their leadership team is beginning to grow.

The first week we will be teaching Heart Freedom 2 to our Indian *Focus on the Heart* leaders. We had wanted our leaders from the Philippines to join this group, but their request for visas for India was denied.

The second week we will lead ABC's Parts 1 and 2 for a larger group of women who have taken *Becoming a Woman of God* and are looking forward to sharpening their ministry skills. In between courses we will have time to meet individually with women who want extra prayer and encouragement.

Remembering that the purpose of Focus on the Heart

is to multiply the number of spiritually mature women worldwide, please pray:

- * that Barbara and I will be especially attentive to the Lord in using the time we have in India, that we will be alert to the needs of the women we are working with and sensitive to His leading.
- * that we will all have hearts open to the Lord to receive everything He has for us at this time.
- * that language and culture will not keep the women from receiving what the Lord has for them through these courses.
- * for the Lord's protection from any attempts of the enemy to disrupt travel plans, to attack the health or circumstances of any of the women or their families, or to frighten or discourage any of us from going on with the Lord.

2013 Mission Offering

June 11, 2013



This year our Annual Conference Mission Offering will go to benefit *Imagine No Malaria*, an organization that seeks to empower the people of Africa to overcome the burden of malaria. *Imagine No Malaria*, an extraordinary effort of the people of the United Methodist Church, calls us to put our faith into action to end preventable deaths caused by malaria in Africa, especially the death of a child or a mother. The offering will be used to purchase nets and medication, and to provide education for those who face the consequences of this disease.

Bishop Davis and the Cabinet have set a goal of raising \$100,000 with this offering, which will be taken at the Mission Celebration on June 11. The purchase of one net costs \$10 and will save one life. Therefore, our goal of \$100,000 will potentially save 10,000 lives. It is our desire that our offering be used in the mission field of the South Sudan, where we have missionaries from the Red Bird Conference already serving.

Christ has called to "Reach the World". May we respond to His challenge with open hearts, willing to take a risk of faith in order to foster health, wholeness and healing. You have an opportunity to give to this mission by June 7. Please make your check to the church and tag it Mission Offering.

Our district is asked to bring individually wrapped adult size toothbrushes to be put in health kits. The district needs 800 of them. These health kits are sent to the UMCOR and are ready to go when disaster strikes anywhere in the world. You may bring your individually wrapped adult size toothbrushes and place them in the basket on the back pew. We will need the toothbrushes no later than June 7. Thank you, Pastor Hawkins.
