Notes from the Pastor: Theme is "Change"

March 25, 2014 yet another bout of winter as we have had more snow. Fortunately, it was a wet snow and did not cause any traveling issues. Spring officially began last week and we have seen evidence of the seasonal change through the budding of trees and the various flowers popping through the ground. It seems as though Winter is not wanting to make the change and is resistant in letting go.

As the seasons change so does change occur in our lives and in the life of our Annual Conference. The first week of April will be the convening session of our Cabinet along with Bishop Davis. They will be making the appointment changes of our pastors and the district superintendents. We need to lift all persons, who are involved in this process of change, in our prayers.

Our Kentucky Annual Conference will meet for the last time in Covington, KY. June 9-11. In the plenary sessions this year, a huge element of change will be proposed. The following information has been sent to all pastors and lay delegates and I quote: "Basically, the leadership of the conference is hoping to pull all of us back on track to what our shared mission is: to make disciples of Jesus Christ. The purpose of the Annual Conference is not to be a big local church, but to discover, develop and send out leaders to our local churches who will lead the rest of us to make disciples. In order to fulfill that purpose, we are going to have to change how we do things. Among the proposed changes are: a re-focusing of the conference staff and the conference budget to more clearly reflect the purpose of the Annual Conference; a reduction of general apportionment asking, so local churches can invest more in local ministry; a reduction of conference financial support of local ministries; a reduction of the number of districts; and a thorough study of how we fund active and retired clergy health insurance. Obviously, these are important changes."

If you would like to know more about these changes, a recording is available at <u>www.kyumc.org</u>. Howard Nichols, lay delegate and I will be attending the sessions and would welcome your feedback. Needless to say, our Annual Conference covets your prayers for wisdom and guidance as these changes are brought to a vote.

I close with asking this question: "How do you handle change in your life, your family, your friends, your community, and your church?





Collection of Box Tops for Education





Easter (Old English *Ēostre*; Latin: *Pascha*; Greek Πάσχα *Paskha*, the latter two derived from Hebrew: Pesah) is a Christian festival and holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his crucifixion at Calvary as described in the New Testament. Easter is the culmination of the Passion of Christ, preceded by Lent, a forty-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance.

The last week of Lent is called Holy Week, and it contains the days of the Easter Triduum, including Maundy Thursday (also known as Holy Thursday), commemorating the Last Supper and its preceding foot washing, as well as Good Friday, commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus. Easter is followed by a fifty-day period called Eastertide, or the Easter Season, ending with Pentecost Sunday.

Easter is a moveable feast, meaning it is not fixed in relation to the civil calendar. The First Council of Nicaea established the date of Easter as the first Sunday after the full moon (the Paschal Full Moon) following the March equinox. Ecclesiastically, the equinox is reckoned to be on 21 March (although the astronomical equinox occurs on 20 March in most years), and the "Full Moon" is not necessarily on the astronomically correct date. The date of Easter therefore varies between 22 March and 25 April inclusive. Eastern Christianity bases its calculations on the Julian calendar, whose 21 March corresponds, during the 21st century, to 3 April in the Gregorian calendar, and in which therefore the celebration of Easter varies between 4 April and 8 May.

Easter is linked to the Jewish Passover by much of its symbolism, as well as by its position in the calendar. In many languages, the words for "Easter" and "Passover" are identical or very similar Easter customs vary across the Christian world, and include sunrise services, exclaiming the Paschal greeting, clipping the church and decorating Easter eggs, a symbol of the empty tomb. Additional customs that have become associated with Easter and are observed by both Christians and some non-Christians include egg hunting, the Easter Bunny, and Easter parades


