The Kentucky Annual Conference was held June 9-11 in Covington, Kentucky. One of three issues that was voted on and passed was the redistricting of our Conference from twelve districts to nine districts. This will take effect June, 2015 at next year's Annual Conference. What that means for our district is the renaming from Frankfort District to whatever is approved through our District Conference. Rev. Dr. Jean Hawxhurst will continue to be our District Superintendent but will assume the leadership over fifteen other Faith Communities. Therefore, she is asking the local Parishes to assume more responsibility and leadership in our district. An example of this would be conducting Charge Conferences with multiple churches. This action would reduce the number of times that our D.S. would have to travel from Charge to Charge.

The second issue our Kentucky Annual Conference proposed and passed was reducing the budget from \$9,134,067 to \$7,959,703 a difference of \$1,174,364. In line with the reduction of the budget, the third issue was reducing apportionment giving from (15%) to (13%) starting in 2015. Our church is giving twelve percent this year.

The Mission Offering to be divided between Blessing House in Thailand and the Red Bird Mission. A little over \$112,000 was collected on Tuesday evening. Thank you church for your contribution of \$614.

This session closed out our sixth time of convening at the Convention Center in Covington, KY. We will meet in Bowling Green, KY. next year June 8-11. That will be entail our voting for delegates to the National Conference and the Jurisdictional Conference which always consumes more time.

Thank you for allowing Howard Nichols and I to be your pastor and delegate to the Conference.


