Talking about a new baby coming into the fellowship of our church, Kristen Noel has resigned from her position as Nursery Coordinator and we are in need of someone to fill this role. Our Nursery provides care for children ages 0-4 for our Sunday morning services. If you would like to help with our Nursery, please contact the church office.

Have you heard the story about the pastor who attended the finance committee and was asked to report to the church? He said, “I’ve got good news and I’ve got bad news. The good news is that we have all the money we need for our budget this year. The bad news is that the money is still in your pocket!”

The financial report given to the Lead Team on August 26th indicated that we are now running in the red for our operating capital. It is not alarmingly low but is heading in that direction unless we, the family of Harrodsburg UMC, rethink our giving pattern. Yes, I know that there are many who are on fixed incomes and are faithful to give their tithe to the Lord. But there may be some of us who haven’t stepped up our giving for some time. In other words, we have given the same amount year after year because that’s what we have programmed ourselves to do. May I challenge us to step up 1% or greater for the rest of the year and help our budget to be reached?

In closing there are two dates to bring to your attention: September 21, 2-3:30p.m. – Safe Sanctuaries Training. Rev. Tonya Kenner will lead us in this workshop. It is required that all personnel, who are involved with children and youth in our church, take this training. The second date is November 30 when we will have our Charge Conference. Rev. Dr. Jean Hawxhurst, our District Superintendent, will be preaching in the 11 a.m. service. We have invited other churches to join us in worship, fellowship, and the conference. They are Burgin, Joseph’s Chapel, Mt. Hebron, Mt. Zion (Shakertown), and Salvisa. We will have a potluck lunch followed by our Charge Conference starting at 1pm.

Collection of Campbell's Soup Labels



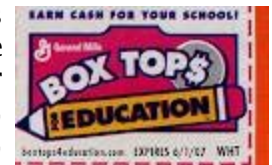

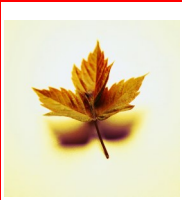
