Pastor's Notes Jan. 2015

On January 27 the Lead Team met and a recommendation was given by John W. Peavler, Chairman of the Trustees. He presented bids on the renovation of the parsonage and they are as follows:

To My Church Family,

I recently returned from a trip to Medellin, Colombia. I want to thank all of you for your prayers and support for this academic endeavor. That's right, it was a class not a mission trip. Asbury Theological Seminary provided me, Na Lim, and six other students with this opportunity to learn more about ministry in an urban setting. I learned so much about Colombia, ministry, and most important about the power of God.

Medellin has often been characterized by the presence of drugs and violence. It was the center of the drug trade in the 80s and 90s, and it was the homicide capital of the world for 16 years (1987-2003). At the peak of the violence there were sometimes up to 25 murders a day, and drug lords were making millions and millions dollars. Medellin is said to have a "Culture of Death," and a common saying was, "I wasn't born to live. I was born to die."

Medellin is no longer experiencing such extreme violence and drug problems. They are still present, but the people and the city are experiencing a beautiful transformation. The government has been a key player in creating transformation, but I know that God's Grace is the main reason for transformation in the lives of people. God is working in lives of numerous people to bring about change, so that Medellin is no longer characterized by death but by LIFE.

I want to briefly describe three different ministries that are sharing God's love to the city. First is the Prison Fellowship. This ministry works with prisoners to restore their lives. Through discipleship this ministry is raising up leaders for the church in prison (**yes, there is a church in prison**), as well as leaders for churches and society outside the walls of the prison. This ministry is bringing redemption to the lives of drug dealers and murderers. The second ministry is the City of Refuge which provides hope for the homeless. Along with providing a refuge for the homeless the ministry has a drug rehab program to break the cycle of drug addiction that plagues Medellin. The third ministry is the soccer ministry/brownie ministry. Youth in Medellin are often swept up by gangs into a life of drugs and violence, so the soccer ministry faces this issue head on by taking youth off the street and putting them into a program of discipleship and soccer training. They also have a brownie business that provides employment, support for the soccer ministry, and really tasty brownies. This is just a snapshot of the ministries in Medellin. There are numerous ministries that God is working through to change Medellin.

Now, I ask you to pray for Colombia. Pray for those still in the cycle of drugs and violence. Pray for those who are still without a home. Pray for those who are laboring for the Lord!
