Will You Give God You?......

This story is about a nine-year-old boy who lived in a rural town in Tennessee. His house was in a poor area of the community. A church there had a bus ministry that came knocking on his door one Saturday afternoon. The boy came to answer the door and greeted the bus pastor.

They went into the living room and sat down on an old couch with the foam and springs exposed. The bus pastor asked the boy, "Where do you go to church?"

The young boy – surprised - his visitor by replying, "I've never been to church in my whole life." The bus pastor thought to himself about the fact that his church was less than three miles from the child's house.

"Are you sure you have never been to church?" he asked again. "I'm sure I haven't," came his answer.

Then the bus pastor said, "Well, son, more importantly than going to church, have you ever heard the greatest love story ever told?" I don't know, came the reply. Then he proceeded to share the Gospel with this little nine-year-old boy. Book Nook


