



Pastor's Ponderings

As I look at the calendar it is hard for me to believe we are pressing in on the end of January. I remember my grandmother always telling me that time goes faster the older you get. I'm not sure that is exactly true. I think we actually cram more on our to do lists; making it feel like time is passing much too quickly.

When I stop and reflect on what and why I do the things I do, I find it a great time for growth. At times it seems that periods of reflection are often too few and far between.

That is why I am thankful for the season of Lent.

Lent is a natural part of the church calendar that calls us to a season of preparation. The Lenten season should never be filled with gloom — an annual ordeal during which we begrudginly forgo a handful of pleasures. Instead, it should be approached as an opportunity. It is meant to be the church's springtime, when out of the darkness of sin's winter, a repentant, empowered person emerges. Lent is a time to let go of excuses, failings and short comings; to stop hanging on to whateer shreds of goodness we perceive in ourselves; a time to ask God to show us what we really look like. And yet our need for repentance cannot erase the good news that Christ overcame all sin. His resurrection frees us from ourselves. His empty tomb turns our attention away from all that is wrong with us and with the world, and spurs us on to experience the abundant life he promises. "Christ must increase, and I must decrease," the apostle John declares. *Taken from the introduction of Bread and Wine-readings for Lent and Easter by Plough Publishing House*.

Just wondering....what would happen if we allowed the Lenten Season of 2018, to be a springtime when out of the darkness of sin's winter, a repentant, empowered person will emerge. May it be a time when we pray daily, "May Christ increase and I decrease." Could it make a difference in us, in our world??
