There are moments in life when perspective rocked by reality shakes us from our personal agendas, causing us to truly understand and live into what it means to be passionate spiritual disciples of Jesus Christ. Those times are especially prevalent "When the storms of life are raging...."

The waters have come in devastating fashion to North and South Carolina, and the people called United Methodist will respond as we always do. We will not be responding for the cameras or the media, but simply because it is who we are. It is who we are called to be as water washed, spirit born children of the living God. We will respond because the love of Jesus Christ compels us. We are the hands and feet of Christ standing with our brothers and sisters, who in most cases have lost everything; some are even grieving the loss of loved ones. We will stand by them, first, with our prayers, making true the words of the hymn writers, "When the storms of life are raging, stand by me; When the world is tossing me like a ship upon the sea, thou who rulest wind and water, stand by me." (Charles Albert Tindley, 1905)

I have no doubt in my mind that generous people of Kentucky will answer the call. If you ask me how I can be so certain, it is because in the two short years of traveling around our annual conference as your bishop I have found people, churches, and communities of faith who possess hearts that respond generously and give whenever and wherever a "Macedonian" call is made. The call comes as the cries of God's people are even now rising from flood waters. We in Kentucky will respond. I know many of you already have done so. We will not only pray, but in our prayers we will seek God's will as to how we can practically respond in the days, weeks, months, and dare I say, even years to come. UMCOR will be our initial way of response; however, I can also say with certainty that when the time comes we will travel with teams as well. We will be the hands and feet of Christ. It's in our spiritual DNA. It is who we are and what we do when we have been transformed by the love of Jesus Christ. Lord, have mercy, Christ have mercy.

I'm writing this on the last day of Summer (September 21). Outside my window, Joe Hubbard is cutting the church grass. The temperature is still at mid-summer levels (although there's a change coming next week, they say!)

I like Autumn's cooler, drier air. I love when the trees change into colorful paintbrushes against the blue sky. I like that I can begin to rotate my wardrobe, bringing out the softer, more comfortable clothes of fall and winter.

I enjoy the change of seasons.

We're experiencing a change of seasons here at Harrodsburg UMC. Of course, I'm part of that—I've been here about 3 months, the length of a season. I'm feeling more comfortable, more at home, and more and more like a Harrodsburg-er. But other seasonal changes are occurring as well. New leadership is being nominated for our church, as part of the Nominations Committees work. Some who have led us well for the last year or last several years are stepping aside, and others are stepping up. This change in leadership will take effect in January of 2019, and I'll be working with these incoming leaders to make sure they're up to speed and ready to go beginning January 1.

As I write this, we're preparing for a "vision meeting." A group of about 20 will meet on Saturday September 22nd

to talk about and dream about the possibility of an after school ministry that would be housed in our youth building. We may be ready to plan and move forward with that, or we may want to wait for a new youth leader to be brought on board. We are working to develop a list of candidates for the job of youth, children's and family ministry coordinator and hope to have that person on board by January 1 as well. But even if we choose to wait, we will wait in active mode—learning and planning and preparing for whatever expanded youth, children, and family ministry looks like.

The Triple Cross Cowboy Church, which meets at our property on the bypass, is also in a season of change. We're trying to find pastoral leadership for that church that can be consistent and long-term, in order to give them the best chance to thrive. I'm also meeting with church leaders in the area to broaden the base of support for this new faith community. Perhaps in 2019, they'll become better established and begin to grow again.

Some changes are more solemn. During my first six weeks here, we lost three members to death—Bill Conover, Henry Anness, and John Landrum. Their deaths affected our congregation in many ways, and their families in deep ways. In the coming year, our congregation will live into a future without their leadership and presence, and that will be a different experience for our church.

Finally, I am beginning to dream of something new for our congregation. I have noticed that our members' homes are clustered in several different locations, from Salvisa in the north through various areas of Harrodsburg and extending into the southern Mercer county area. As I pray over the map of our homes, it occurs to me that there might be some opportunities for home-based groups that can serve our needs in several ways. These groups can be places of study and discipleship, as we learn more of the love God has for us in Christ. They can be places of nurture, where we form deeper relationships with one another. And, they can serve as comfortable "first steps" for new persons who want to experience what Harrodsburg UMC is all about. At present, this is a dream—perhaps it will become a vision for some future ministry here at HUMC. But I invite you to pray and dream with me, as in the coming several years we learn to ask God what our next steps might be, and then to trust God to give us the ability to take those steps into the future God is creating for us.

Summer turns to fall. The past becomes the present, and points to the future. But through it all is the presence of God, as we read in James 1:17: "Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." Change is inevitable in our lives, but God's love for us perseveres and prevails through it all.






